MESSAGE FROM BOARD CHAIR & CEO



The past year at YWCA Saskatoon has been nothing short of transformative. Just one year ago, we were striving to reach the finish line of our capital campaign. Today, we stand together in celebration of its remarkable success. The completion of our new Transitional Housing Wing, Hopeful Hearts, has brought that vision to life — offering 35 units and 75 beds that now serve as a lifeline for women, and children across our city.

But our work extends far beyond bricks and mortar. At YWCA Saskatoon, we know that a safe place to stay is only the beginning. Stability, dignity, and opportunity are what truly change lives. That is why the next phase of our Hope Lives Here campaign is focused on strengthening and expanding the services that create lasting impact.

This includes much-needed renovations to our main crisis shelter, and the expansion of our Employment and Learning Centre, where clients gain the skills, training, and confidence they need to achieve sustainable employment and independence.

We are also thrilled to share that the Ministry of Education has approved 90 new licensed daycare spaces for our community. With nearly 600 families currently on our waitlist, this is a vital step forward in addressing the pressing childcare shortage. Our team is actively working to secure a downtown location that will bring these new spaces to life.

None of these milestones would be possible without the people who bring our mission to life each day. To our dedicated employees — your compassion, resilience, and unwavering commitment are the heartbeat of YWCA Saskatoon.

We are equally grateful for the generosity of our donors, the leadership of our Capital Cabinet and Board of Directors, and the steadfast support of our community. Together, you make hope tangible.

While we celebrate these accomplishments, we also remain deeply mindful of the challenges that persist. Homelessness in our city has reached an all-time high, and too many families continue to struggle without safe housing or supports. In this reality, our resolve only strengthens.

At YWCA Saskatoon, we believe in the power of hope. Hope is what gives a woman the courage to leave a dangerous situation. Hope is what sustains a family when the path forward feels uncertain. And hope is what drives us all toward the belief in a brighter, more just tomorrow.





We are thrilled to announce the official opening of Hopeful Hearts, a new 35-unit, 75-bed transitional housing wing that will significantly enhance our ability to provide refuge for women and children escaping violence and trauma.

By investing in this additional space, we hope to address the rising demand for shelter, ensuring more women and families have a secure, supportive environment to rebuild their lives after tragedy.



YWCA Saskatoon is dedicated to enhancing quality of life for all our residents. As we begin renovations of our existing shelter space, we look forward to seeing improvements not only in structural integrity of the facility – but in creating warmer, more welcoming spaces that foster a sense of community and comfort.

Success Story from our Crisis Counsellor:

This year, our team partnered with an out-ofprovince community organization to support a young lady fleeing a dangerous situation. Working closely together, we arranged for her to stay in our shelter, helped her secure essential identification, and guided her through the process of accessing financial supports.

With stability in place, she was accepted into our transitional housing program, where she now has plans to complete her education and continue planning her next steps. This collaboration required extraordinary effort from both organizations and demonstrated how far-reaching partnerships can change the course of someone's life.




